#### **DUTY OR DESIRE?**

What motivates my obedience to God? It's a question I've been pondering anew in recent days. I've noticed how too often, as I stir up myself and the Lord's sheep to fulfill the duties of discipleship, to pursue greater conformity to God's will, I motivate with a reminder of "should"—you "should" take seriously the vows of your church membership, you "should" be growing in your knowledge of the Word and the discipline of prayer, you "should" share the Gospel with others.

I suppose it is better to obey than to disobey, no matter the motivation, but the Lord has me impressed upon me the old truth that mere compliance, check-the-box fulfillment of duty, is not the obedience he seeks from his people. Rather, it is obedience that flows from a heart in love with God.

The central drama of the Bible is, as commentator Dan Doriani puts it simply: "God loves us and we love him in return." God's work in sending his Son as Savior and the Holy Spirit as Giver of spiritual life is that of a Lover pursuing one passionately loved. As all who have loved another deeply know, nothing less than the sincere, reciprocated affection of the beloved will suffice. That affection is expressed in obedience to his Word and commands, yes, but only as the living expression of a heart enraptured with him.



It is easy to allow our love for Jesus to cool the longer we walk with him. Much like a marriage of many years, the passion is prone to wane as we settle into our life in covenant relationship. And so it's worth considering: How much are we doing the right things as a matter of mere habit? How much does our struggle to muster up the motivation to do what we "should" step from the fact that, frankly speaking, we "abandoned the love we had at first" (Rev. 2:4). (continued on page 2)

Let me challenge you as I have challenged myself—stir up your love for the One who first loved you. Think upon his glory and grace and the wonder of being caught up (quite in spite of yourself) in his purposes of redemption. Gaze upon his beauty and learn again the delight of his presence. My guess is that such renewal of the heart will do the work of moving us to fulfill our "ought" in a way that a thousand wagging fingers never could.

Also, I want you all to be aware so you can be engaged with two events in particular on these months' church calendar. One is Missions Emphasis Sunday (MES), our version of a Missions Conference, on February 28. From your offerings and through the leadership of the Outreach Team. FPC supports some 15 outside ministries and missionaries, both locally and globally. We feature in rotation those we support in the bulletin and weekly email as the "Supported Ministry of the Week." We will have a combined Sunday School class that week that will feature video and in-person updates from many, and we will highlight others as a part of worship. I hope becoming more aware of their work compels us to prayer for them and a renewed sense of the call the Lord Jesus gives to each of us to be his ambassadors in our place.

# Quarter Notes from Seth

#### Isaiah 6:1-3

In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!"

This is one of my favorite passages. It really paints a glorious and terrifying picture of Almighty God. Our God is so big! It's easy sometimes to think we have everything under control, without realizing it putting God in a self-defined box.

I struggle to trust Him for the most basic of things. On my worst days, I actually think I can live my life without his aid or notice. It is usually at that exact moment that God sends some kind of a reproof of life - something to remind me how incredibly dependent I am. Suddenly I have great need of Him! One of the most important lessons I've learned and am still learning, is to praise God for these moments. Praise Him because it is in these moments I can see God as He is, and myself as I am. And it is in that place of humility that God's grace abounds.

There are so many opportunities for dependence on God, such a need for grace these days. So many are hurting! I believe this is our moment!



So here's to praising God in the hardest of times knowing that He is giving us the opportunity to discern His will! My prayer is that as we worship our Lord in this new year, we will see ourselves as Isaiah did and respond in humility to our Creator who is worthy of all praise and glory!

And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!"


