

A word from Pastor Ryan,

This calendar year I will be taking our Session through the book by George Yancey pictured here, "One Body One Spirit: Principles of Successful Multiracial Churches." Through this I hope to lead our church to press into the vision the Lord gave us even before my time here to be a place of Gospel reconciliation—where black and white, rich and poor live out the unity that is ours in Christ and by his Gospel. Yancey's book, more than any other I've read on the subject, lays out a practical game plan for how to successfully do this.

This discussion is relevant to all who are part of the family of God at FPC and so I commend the book to you for your reading. We are all stewards of this vision the Lord has given, and our unity in it is crucial for the future health and growth of our church. We need everyone to be a part of the conversation, as both learners and contributors. I intend to use my newsletter articles this year to introduce the ideas of the book to those who might not get around to reading it (I'm a realist, you know!). So now, for the 30,000-foot overview....

Yancey is a Christian sociologist. The book is based on a study done in the late 1990s by the Lily Foundation on multiracial churches in the US (the book was published in 2003). Yancey identifies seven characteristics of churches that have been successful in achieving and maintaining racial diversity. They are—

MORE OF PASTOR RYAN'S LETTER

Inclusive Worship: The corporate worship of successful multi-racial churches includes the cultural elements of more than one racial group. Or, as I like to say it, it "creates cultural space for those who are in minority of the church."

Diverse Leadership: The leadership of such churches consists of members of more than one racial group. Particularly, it includes members of the racial minority the church seeks to include.

Overarching Goal: Successful multi-racial churches do not make diversity the goal of their churches. The goal is something greater, like effectively reaching the community with the Gospel, to which diversity is a means.


