PASTOR RYAN'S LETTER

I apologize for the delay in getting a newsletter out, but here it is! Praise God that our lives are getting back to normal, including our lives in the Lord's church. There is much ministry stuff to be aware of, so give this thing a close read.

MISSING CHURCH

"The danger of missing church is that soon you won't miss it." A quote something like this circulated on social media recently and it made me wonder how truly it applies to us at FPC. In honesty, it has been a challenge to get back to the level of attendance in corporate worship we had before the pandemic. The reason I hear most often to explain this is "folks have just gotten out of the habit." I know it is easier to stay in your pis and watch online or catch the service later on replay—and there are situations where doing so is perfectly legitimate—but let me warn you, as your pastor, against doing so as a habit.

Worship is not a show that you consume, it is a participation in the communion we share with Christ and, through Him, with one another. The toxic individualism that persuades professing Christians to consider corporate worship and fellowship as inconsequential or merely supplementary to the Christian life is, I think, one of Satan's most successful lies in our day. How often I have seen this



logic deceive people, drawing them into worldly ways of thinking and acting, derailing their growth in the Christian life.

And so, I pray that each of you would again miss missing church. I urge you, for your own sake and our church body's, to get yourself back in your pew this Sunday to add your (actual) voice to our corporate song of praise. Remember that everything we do as a church flows through and from our weekly time of worship on the Lord's Day. Even as we think about expanding our ministry to include Wednesday night programs, these are meant to build upon and not take the place of Sunday. We are "the Church" most truly when we are gathered before the Lord in worship.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH MINISTRY

You'll remember how a few months ago I broached the topic of our church's vision and ministry direction through a series of Facebook Live posts. The feedback revealed a couple things: 1) there is no consensus about the need to alter our vision statement (which is fine with me), and 2) there is solid consensus about the wisdom of focusing on building children and youth ministry as the next step in the life of EPC.

Therefore, this Fall we are aiming to kickoff regular, Wednesday evening ministries aimed at kids and vouth. We are in the process of hiring a Children's Ministry Director who will lead the ministry to kids and building a volunteer team to lead youth ministry. Our dream is to see young people from our church, our school, and our neighborhood gathering each week to learn more about Jesus and experience the community the Holy Spirit creates. We dream of Wednesday night being a door through which families enter both into Christ and the covenant community of FPC. We dream of it being a shared labor of leadership in which many discover (or rediscover) the joy of ministry, of using the gifts God has given to bless others and build up the Kingdom.

This crucial-for-the-future undertaking is one that cannot be done sustainably with just a few. We need our church members to plan to make Wednesday night at church a "given" of your weekly schedule come Fall. If you have kids and grandkids in town, start talking it up to get them excited about being involved. We promise to do everything we can to make them want to be there, but at first they will likely need your encouragement. Consider if the

Lord might be calling for you to lend a hand in these ministries. We will have dinner, bible study. and prayer opportunities for adults during this time too, so plan to be there even if you're not leading.

There are a number of summer events highlighted in this newsletter. Our big children's ministry event for the summer is our **Creation Care Camp on June 21-25**. Please sign up your child immediately if you haven't so that we can prepare. Also we still need adults and teens to assist in leading, so talk to Leslie if you're willing to serve. In preparation for CCC, on **June** 18-19 we'll have what I am calling our Community Outreach Blitz.. A group from Eddie and Jennine Wyatt's former church in Kansas City is travelling to partner with us in this effort. On Saturday morning we will gather for breakfast to do some brief evangelism training, followed up with canvassing our neighborhood in groups of 3. We want to show the hospitality of FPC by welcoming these folks and making every effort to attend.
